I was warned, "Don't get a big one!" Thankfully, this time I heeded the warning and ordered a small ice cream cone at The Viking in Ventura, and I'm glad I did! The small was truly a large. I saw the large and it could feed a family of four. So, to those who warned me, I say, "Thank you!"

The problem with some of us is that we think we can handle the large, or in some sense since we are adults, we deserve a large. Consider the words of the Apostle Paul,
